

Marion Bridge to Albert Bridge — Chart Information

Notification: Following several requests, a sketch chart of the area of the Mira River between Marion Bridge and Albert Bridge has been prepared. It is available as a free download.

Format: PDF-format for viewing on a laptop or tablet, for home printing, or for printing by a print-shop such as Kwik-Kopy, Staples, UPS, etc.

Two versions are currently available:

1. A single-page version intended for printing on 12" x 40" paper.
2. A three-page version intended for printing on legal (8½" x 14") paper.

Printing: Print-shops may print the single-page on a heavyweight paper for \$10 or less. Other sizes may suit your preference. The 3-page version can be used as three pages or cut and pasted to form a single chart. Laser printing is recommended for clarity and resistance to moisture. Some print-shops can print the on a vinyl 'banner' material to give a waterproof chart. **This chart is 'preliminary' and will be updated prior to the boating season. We suggest that users delay printing until boating season begins.**

NOTES:

1. Buoys:
 - a. All buoys are unlighted.
 - b. Buoys are 'seasonal', and are usually placed by 15 May and lifted after 15 November.
 - c. Buoys may be repositioned to mark the best water.
 - d. Stakes may also be used in shallow areas.
2. Depths:
 - a. Depths are in feet.
 - b. Depth data for the areas indicated by the darker shade of blue are unavailable. Depths of less than 3 feet may be encountered. These areas should only be navigated with 'local knowledge', and with caution.

CAUTION: Information on the chart is 'preliminary' and is subject to revision and correction. A revised edition will be issued by the end of April 2020.

FEEDBACK: Boaters and users are requested to provide comments as to the utility of the chart and input concerning corrections and suggested additions or improvements, in time for the coming boating season.
